
National Cadet Corps (NCC) Lt.R.Ramji has contributed to Shramdaan on Swacch Bharat on 01.10.2023.

Pro Simulator Software Training was organized for Mechanical Engineering students by SIM Infosystem on 12.09.2023 & 13.09.2023.






